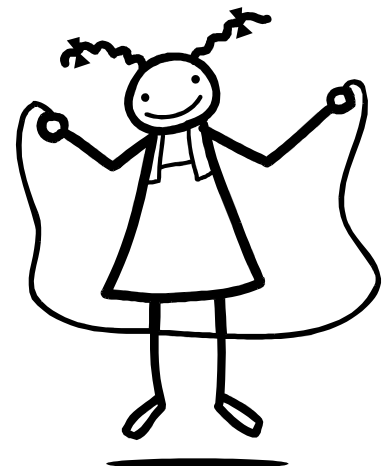

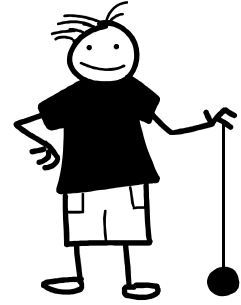

# What To Bring To Camp Everyday

We suggest wearing comfortable and practical clothing.

**Please mark all clothing with the first and last name of your camper**

We do our best to keep track of your campers belongings and will return lost items when found if they are marked. B'nai B'rith Camp cannot assume responsibility for lost or damaged items.

**Campers should come wearing sneakers or sandals, not flip flops.**

The following items are not allowed at camp:

*Gum, herbs, vitamins, over the counter medications, drugs, alcohol, cigarettes, matches, lighters, candles, incense, fireworks, pornography, television, all wireless devices, electronic games, water balloons, aerosol spray cans of any type, shaving cream, squirt guns, toy guns, knives, or swords, skate boards, weapons.*

## What To Expect The First Day Of Camp

A lice check will be conducted for each camper on the first day of each session.

Physician Statement, Authorization for Pick-Up, must be turned in to the camp office as well as all fees paid for new campers.

Campers will be put in unit groups depending on their grade level in the fall.

Each Unit will have counselors who will stay with their Unit for the session.

There will also be a Unit Head who supervises all 3 Units.

Pre-School Unit      3 and 4 and Kindergarten in the fall.

Younger Unit:        First grade through Grade 2

Older Unit:            Grade 3 through Grade 6

Our amazing counseling staff will work hard to make your child comfortable in their unit. A quick goodbye can help with this transition. Please direct special needs or concerns to the Unit Head or the Day Camp Director.

### Drop Off and Pick Up

For the safety of our campers, cars must park in the upper lot and campers must be checked in at the Yurt.

Pick up will be at the picnic table by the office at 4pm, later pick up at the Yurt.

For the safety of our campers our staff will not release campers to anyone who is not on the Pick-Up Authorization list.

**A drivers license or some form of picture ID will be requested.**

# Illnesses or Emergencies

If a child does not feel well enough to participate in the activities of the day, parents will be called to pick up the child. If your child is ill and will not be at camp, please notify the camp office as soon as possible. We ask that parents notify the Day Camp Director of any communicable disease a child has, such as measles, chicken pox, lice, etc., so that we may notify other parents. Please be considerate of others, we need to keep in mind the health and well being of our entire camp community.

Please keep your child at home if he/she:

- has a fever of 100 degrees or higher or has had one during previous 24hrs.
- Is vomiting or has diarrhea.
- has heavy nasal discharge not directly related to allergies.
- has a constant cough that interferes with activity.
- has redness of the eye, obvious discharge, matted eyelashes, burning, and/or itching eyes.
- have symptoms of communicable disease.
